# DAY 01 : CATCH FLIGHT FOR MUMBAI \*\* HANOI - = - HOTEL TRANSFER

Arrive at Noi Bai International Airport, welcome by our guide and transfer to your hotel. The transfer distance is approximately 40 munites. Hanoi or "River-bound City" as its name literally means is Vietnam's capital with a thousand-year-old history dating back to 1010. The city's fascinating beauty which is characterized by unique cultural relics, ancient streets of antique houses, elegant French colonial buildings, tree-lined boulevards and romantic lakes has made it one of the most charming cities of Asia.

### DAY 02: HANOI - = - FULL DAY CITY TOUR

Morning: Visit Ho Chi Minh Complex which features the life of Ho Chi Minh, the nation's founder. At the complex, visit the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, the colonial Presidential Palace, the One Pillar Pagoda. Continue to the Temple of Literature, known as the first university of Vietnam built in 1070 by the Ly Dynasty to honor Confucius, sages and outstanding Vietnamese scholars.

Afternoon: continue the tour to one of the following museums of choice namely: the Museum of Fine Arts, the National Museum of Vietnamese History, the Museum of Revolution, the Museum of Military History or the Museum of Ethnology. Late afternoon, visit Hoan Kiem Lake and Ngoc Son Temple located on an islet in the lake. Hoan Kiem Lake is the center point of Hanoi and home to a rare endangered giant turtle species. Its name "Returned Sword" comes from a legend of a sacred sword being lent to an ancient Vietnamese King by a holy turtle from the lake and later returned to the turtle. Shop or walk at leisure in the Old Quarter of 36 ancient streets.

# DAY 03: HANOI - 🚝 - HA LONG

Morning pickup at 8:00 AM from your hotel for transfer to Ha Long Bay, which is about 160 km or 3.5-hour drive away. On the way, you will see some rural areas of the Red River Delta with plenty of chances to take photos of Vietnamese farmers working in paddy fields. Stop half way to visit a handicraft workshop of fine clothes and embroidered paintings. Arrive in Ha Long City at 11:30 AM and check in aboard the booked junk right after the welcome drink is served. Start cruising while having lunch on board and enjoy the mighty bay view. Ha Long Bay meaning Descending Dragon Bay in Vietnamese as legend has it that it was where a holly dragon landed down from sky. The bay, famous as one of the world's wonders and heritage sites whose formation dates back 500 million years, consists of around 2,000 karst islands and islets scattered over an area of 1,553 km2. The bay cruise will continue with up close sighting of Dinh Huong Island, Ga Choi Island, Dog Island, Sail Island, a visit to Sung Sot

Cave and swimming stop at Titov Beach. Relax to enjoy the bay view at sunset, have dinner after, go fishing at 09:00 PM and spend a night on board.

# DAY 04: HA LONG - = - HANOI TI FLIGHT TO SAIGON

Early risers can enjoy the splendid yet tranquil view of the bay at the crack of dawn. Breathe the sea's fresh air, feel the morning breeze and hear the sounds of birds above. Have breakfast and cruise to visit Human head shaped island and Tortoise Island. Continue to cruise into Bai Tu Long Bay to discover the adjacent bay of "The Little Dragon Bowing to His Mother" as it is named. Check out and have lunch on board while heading to shore. Disembark and transfer back to Hanoi airport for flight to Ho Chi Minh

Arrive in Saigon city, welcome by our guide and transfer to hotel for check in.

Ho Chi Minh City formerly named Saigon is the largest city and economic center of Vietnam always bustled with activities of modern life. It is where businesses converge and shoppers indulge themselves into unlimited choices. However the city also carries with it a rich historical legacy in contrast with its dazzling glamor.

### DAY 05: SAIGON - FULL DAY CU CHI TUNNEL AND CITY TOUR

Morning, take a half-day tour to the Cu Chi Tunnels, 75 km Northwest of downtown Ho Chi Minh City, which were once a major underground hideout and resistance base of Viet Cong forces during the two wars against the French and later on Americans. The tunnels, entirely hand-dug, formed a highly intricate network of interlinked multilevel passageways at times stretched as far as the Cambodian border and totaling over 120 km in length. Its complexity was beyond imagination containing meeting rooms, kitchens, wells, clinics, schools, depots, trenches and emergency exits all aimed for guerrilla warfare. The tunnels were deep and strong enough to withstand destructive bombings and self-contained enough to outlast prolonged sieges. Back to Saigon

Afternoon, take a half-day city tour to visit outside of Saigon Notre-Dame Basilica (is renovating until 2023), a neo-Roman cathedral built by the colonial French with materials entirely imported from Marseilles, Saigon Central Post Office, which was designed and constructed in the early 20th Century by the famous French architect Gustave Eiffel. Then, visit the War Remnants Museum, which features an extensive collection of exhibits including weaponry, photos and documentation on Vietnam's wars with the French and Americans. End of day, you have free time to go shopping at Ben Thanh Market

### DAY 06 : SAIGON - FULL DAY MYTHO (MEKONG DELTA) 65KM-2HOUR DRIVING

Morning, after breakfast, travel by road to the Mekong Delta, the world's largest delta and Vietnam's largest rice bowl. On arrival in My Tho City, capital of Tieng Giang Provine, embark on a boat and navigate through intricate canals while observing the local daily life up close as well as the landscape of waterways and lush islands. Land on the Unicorn Island to enjoy wandering through verdant orchards, tasting fresh fruits and listening to some Southern style traditional music. Move on to the second delta province, Ben Tre, where you will watch local villagers make coconut candy in a rural workshop, walk around briefly and try riding a horse-pulled carriage. More cruising to some beekeeping households to taste fresh homegrown honey and honey tea. Go back Ho Chi Minh City and spend time at leisure.

#### **NEED-TO-KNOW LOCAL CULTURE: DO'S AND DON'TS IN VIETNAM**

Before traveling to a new country, do some research on local etiquette and customs so you're ready to experience the local culture and sites without unknowingly offending anyone. In Vietnam, local people are very appreciative of travelers who try to abide by their customs, and very forgiving if you get it wrong. To maximize your visit to this intriguing and beguiling country, these are our tips for you to avoid culture shocks and enjoy Vietnam in the happiest way it should be.

#### Do's when visiting Vietnam

- 1. Dress appropriately Dress conservatively, especially for female travellers. The Vietnamese are quite conservative about their dress, and it would be disrespectful to wear skimpy clothing in public.
- 2. Respect at temples When visiting temples and pagodas keep your arms and legs covered. A sarong is very handy, and make sure your knees are covered at the very least. It is again disrespectful to go to such places if you do not observe these.
- 3. Remove bling Do remove unnecessary jewelry, as it shows that you have money, and could make you a target for petty theft. Keep all valuables in a safe place. If you have much cash, you can divide into several parts and put them in different places with you, in case you meet the pickpocket or lose money elsewhere.
- 4. Keep your bag safe Do hold your bag in front of you, wrapped around your shoulder, so that you are not a victim of a drive-by bag snatcher. Unfortunately, you need to be vigilant as bag snatching is a big problem, even at temples and pagodas.
- 5. Know where you stay. Do make sure that you have a hotel business card from the reception desk. This will make your return to the hotel in a taxi or motorbike much easier.
- 6. Negotiate and get a fixed price. Always firmly negotiate the exact price before you get on the back of a motorbike or buy anything on the streets.
- 7. Buy legitimate bottled water Do buy bottled water, but not any bottled water. You will pay less for a bottle of beer than a bottle of water. Keep a non-disposable water bottle on you and fill it up with boiled or purified water whenever you get the chance. Instead of buying bottled water which is both expensive and bad for the environment.
- 8. Ask before you shoot Do ask permission before you take a photo of people. Many locals may be uncomfortable or will expect payment before you take the photo. Pay it. It is not a lot of VND, the currency of Vietnam.
- 9. Keep toilet paper with you Do carry some toilet paper with you at all times. While there are fewer squats in urban areas, there are still many in rural areas.
- 10. Use chopsticks correctly Do use your chopsticks correctly. Sticking them upright in your bowl of rice, for example, is considered unlucky, as this is the symbol of two burning joss sticks used for funerals.
- 11. Do eat local food in Vietnam Do enjoy the local Vietnamese food, which is some of the best in the world. Consider doing a street food tour to get to some of the hidden gems in the back streets of Hanoi.
- 12. Money exchange Certainly confirm the exchange rate before exchanging.

#### **Don'ts when visiting Vietnam**

- 1. Don't end up in jail Don't take photos of any military installations and equipment, it is a breach of national security and you could end up in jail, and you do not want to spend your vacations ...and a bit ... at a Vietnamese jail.
- 2. Watch your tootsies Don't sit with your feet pointing towards a family altar if you are staying at someone's house.
- 3. Observe the altars Don't turn your back to the altars when you are in a temple or someone's home, or pointing with one finger to the worshipped gods will really upset them. Use your whole palm if needed, and well behave when you are at the site. The Vietnamese are very spiritual.

- 4. No chopstick playing Don't play with the chopsticks for fun music when you are at a meal table, as the Vietnamese don't want hungry and homeless ghosts to come.
- 4. NO PDA Don't publically kiss and cuddle. These personal displays of affection are not considered appropriate in Vietnam. Holding hands is ok, particularly as you cross the manically busy roads.
- 5. Don't hesitate when crossing a road Don't suddenly stop or panic as you cross the busy roads. Frightening as it can be, just keep walking. Look at the drivers and wave your hand in the air. The traffic will avoid you. Stay calm and keep walking, no matter what.
- 6. Be respectful in ethnic minority villages Don't take video cameras into the ethnic minority villages. They are considered to be too intrusive by many local people. If you do, always ask permission first.
- 7. Sleep quality Don't expect a good sleep in while traveling in Vietnam, loud noises start on the streets from 6am. If you need a sleep in, bring ear plugs.

These Do's & Don'ts when Visiting Vietnam are mostly common sense, but it always pays to be prepared when visiting the most amazing country of Vietnam. Obviously, everyone should know "When you are in Vietnam, do as the Vietnamese do". Good lucks!
